

Dear Colleagues,

The European Association for Dental Public Health is running a follow up workshop - Oral Epidemiology 2, which will cover all the topics not covered during the 2014 workshop held in Prague.

The Workshop will be held at the Hotel Devin in Bratislava on 12/13 November 2015. Thanks to generous support by Colgate we can offer 12 subsidised places for to EADPH members from economically less well off countries and a further 18 places with no subsidy for EADPH members from better off countries.

The EADPH definition of economically less well off countries is those with a per capita annual GNI of less than \$US 15,000 per year.

The following countries qualify: Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Georgia, Kosovo, Latvia, Lithuania, Macedonia, Moldova, Montenegro, Poland, Romania, Russian Federation, Serbia, Turkey, Ukraine.

The subsidy will cover accommodation for two nights, workshop materials, meals and partial reimbursement of travel costs.

The deadline for registration is September 30, 2015. However, those who wish to apply for subsidized places should apply immediately as they will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis.

The accommodation for participants is booked in the Hotel Devin, which is in the Centre of Bratislava for nights of 11-12 and 12-13 November 2015. .

Participants who intend to come to Bratislava sooner or plan to stay longer should contact Simona Dianiskova and state their requirements on the registration form when they complete it.

All participants must add their EADPH personal membership code when they complete the registration form.
