Instructions for Poster Presenters at the 17th Annual Congress of the European Association of Dental Public Health.

Dear Poster Presenter,

Please read and follow these instructions carefully for the preparation and presentation of posters at the 17th EADPH conference in London.

Technical Information for Posters:

Maximum height of the poster: 120 cm. Maximum width of the poster: 90 cm. The text, illustrations etc. should be large enough to be read from a distance of two meters (six feet). People who received a travel grant should acknowledge this on their poster.

Further details:

Posters should be a single sheet made from paper or thin cardboard. Heavy poster materials may be difficult to keep in position on the poster boards. Please use the reference number of your abstract / poster in the upper left corner of your poster. It is also recommended that you place a small photograph of the presenting author in the upper right corner of your poster.

Poster Mounting

Material for mounting will be available in the poster area. Poster presenters are advised to provide handouts for interested delegates. There is sufficient time and room for all posters to be displayed during the conference. The mounting time is on Thursday, 15 November 2012 between 13.00 and 13:30. The welcome ceremony will start at 14:00 on the same day. The posters can be removed on Friday, 16th November after 17:00 hours.

Poster Viewing / Discussions

There will be one poster session On Friday at 14:15 until 17:00. Parallel poster sessions will take place in the committee rooms. For each presentation 7 minutes will be available: 5 minutes for oral presentation of the main results and 2 minutes for discussion. Please bring 2 or 3 microsoft powerpoint slides on a USB flash drive or CD; on one slide present the main aims and materials/methods and on the second slide the results and conclusions. Please DO NOT copy your poster onto the slides because no one will be able to read them in the parallel sessions. It is very important to make the size of letters and numbers large enough to read.

Conference Venue

The conference venue is The Royal Institute of British Architects [RIBA], 66 Portland Place, City of Westminster, London W1B 1AD
